Orange County has very limited choices for those who need emergency housing. HomeAid has aggressive plans to address this issue with immediate housing solutions and support services, but we need help to realize the vision.

Orange County is one of the wealthiest counties in the United States with over 3 million in residence, yet thousands of people find themselves homeless and without shelter every day.

- More than 12,000 individuals are homeless
- Over 2,500 of our homeless are school aged children and live in shelters

Many people believe that the homeless are on the street due to choice, but the real truth is most are experiencing homelessness due to circumstances such as job loss, illness, abandonment, abuse or the financial ability to make ends meet. These circumstances have left them in need of our help.

Launched six (6) new housing development projects

HomeAid's shelter developments house 6,000 homeless annually

SERVICE

HomeAid Essentials distributed over 1,000,000 diapers and other items to homeless babies and their mothers

Distributed over 4,000 CareKits to Orange County residents residing on the streets

During the month of November, for Homeless Awareness Month, 20,000 items were donated and made into 300 CareKits, 100 stockings for the homeless, hundreds of gently used clothing distributed to homeless

Over 1,000 volunteers throughout donated time for all CareDays, Essentials Activities, to Build CareKits, prepare Sack Lunches, assist at partner provider locations and much more.
