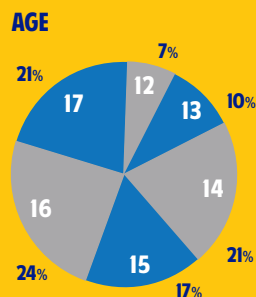

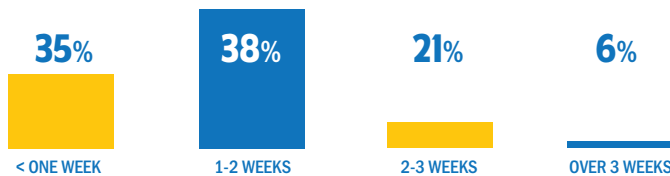

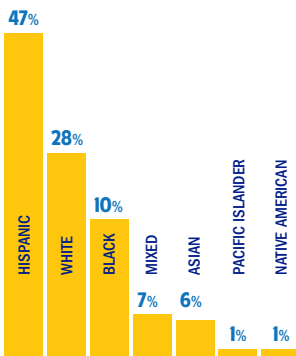
LENGTH OF STAY

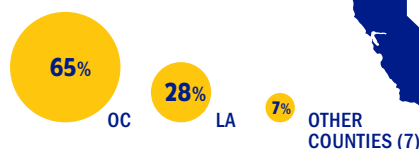
